Sometimes in our service to the Lord, we stand on the shoulders of people who have toiled before us. Today was example of that.

It started by visiting a grade school. Previously the evangelical churches could not get into the schools. But this trip we can. There was 250-300 kids that gathered this morning to hear us. We played Simon Says, sang a song and then I presented the gospel to them. About 75 raised their hands when I asked if they had prayed that prayer for the first time. There was no way to get an accurate count. But God knows and that's all that matters.

From there we went across the street to a neighborhood. Neighborhoods are called villages and they are run by a village chief. Think of it as a HOA run by one person and no board. Never before have churches been allowed to spread the gospel in this area. Today that changed. We made several visits and saw several people pray to receive forgiveness from God. And one of the participating churches was asked to come back and do weekly Bible study.

After lunch we went to the local market and talked with vendors and people there. We encountered several people who were already Christians and a few that weren't. One man we talked to was of the "all

gods lead to Heaven," mindset. We told Him about Jesus; but wasn't quite convinced. We left him with a testimony.

Tomorrow (Tuesday) we will be in another market in the morning followed by two schools (primary and secondary) with a evangelistic service in the evening at one of the churches.

The weather was not too hot today. Continue to pray that we will have strength and energy and the weather will not be hot.
