



## Farewell to Fiji

I write this from the airport as our plane has been delayed a second time due to mechanical issues. At this point, we will not make our next connection. Such is the state of air travel in our day and age.

Friday we were in another village talking to people. Two different three generation families, a man who was a Christian and prays regularly for the work of Christ, an older man who needed Jesus.

In the afternoon we went to hospital to visit patients and pray with them. A woman who looked Muslim and her son who were not open the gospel; a man and his wife who were believers; a man in isolation who would accept Jesus. However, the most memorable visit would be to a patient that just had his leg amputated for diabetes. Around him is a wife, a daughter, another man from a nearby bed. The daughter is Christian, the mom is Muslim and I presume the father is too. I begin my gospel presentation and notice that the wife of the man in the adjacent bed is listening intently. She appears to be Hindu. He is not coherent. When I ask if they want to receive the Gift of God, they all say, "Yes."

Friday evening is closing rally. It's always great to hear stories from the other missionaries and to see how God was at work this week. Ginger and I presented the gospel to 186 and 97 prayed to accept Christ. For the whole project, 3000+ heard the gospel and 526 prayed to receive the Lord and we saw many redications.

Thank you for your prayers and support. The project was a success. Lives are changed. Glory to God.
