A 45 minute drive this morning puts us in the town of Ba. In the morning we walked through a village talking to people. A man and his teenage daughter who know the Lord, a woman and her two children who knew of Jesus but hadn't accepted as savior and others. It is much warmer today.

After our work in the village, we go into town and work the streets downtown. Ba has a higher number of Indian immigrants. The Fijians are very friendly and smile a lot. Those from India, not so much.

We drive back to the hotel (another 45 minutes) spend some time in the air conditioning before driving back to Ba (90 minutes because of traffic) for a church service in the evening.

The service is outdoor at the church on the edge of the village we were at in the morning. The speakers are turned up loud so the whole neighborhood can hear. This is not Sunday morning in a Baptist church in Texas. There is singing, dancing and soulful praising the Lord and

praying for those that need healing. Another long drive back to the hotel arriving around 11.

Friday is our last day in the field. There are three elderly ladies in our group and they are struggling. Pray for their strength.
